

Rosa's Spanish Number Market

Learning objective: To identify and write Spanish numbers from 1 to 20 and apply them to a practical context using currency.

Follow the drawing prompt below to create your market scene. Once finished, use the word bank to label your items and complete the maths-based Spanish questions.

Draw: Draw a vibrant market stall for Rosa the parrot. On the stall, include: 1 large basket of apples, 10 colourful books stacked neatly, and 15 bunches of grapes. Draw price tags next to each group of items using the Spanish words for the quantities (e.g., a tag saying '10 - diez' next to the books). Use a bright, cheerful art style with clear labels for each set of objects.



Label words: uno (1) · cinco (5) · diez (10) · quince (15) · veinte (20) · manzanas · libros

Steps:

1. Rosa is buying 5 apples. If each apple costs £2, calculate the total cost in pounds. Write the number of apples in Spanish.
2. Explain why it is useful to know how to count to twenty when visiting a Spanish-speaking market. Justify your answer.
3. If you have £20 (veinte libras) and you buy 10 books that cost £1 each, how much change would you

receive? Show your calculation.

4. Compare and contrast the number 15 (quince) and 5 (cinco). What pattern do you notice in their spelling?

5. What might happen if you miscounted your change at a market? How could knowing your Spanish numbers prevent this?

6. Creative Task: Invent a new item for Rosa to sell. Draw it and write its price tag using a Spanish number and the £ symbol.
