

Rosa's Spanish Market Stall

Learning objective: To recall and apply Spanish numbers 1–50 within a practical money-based context.

Rosa the parrot is helping out at the school garden market. She has labelled her produce with Spanish price tags. Match the Spanish number words to the correct total prices in pounds (£) by drawing lines to connect them. Then, help Rosa calculate the total cost of two items by writing the sum in Spanish words.

Word bank: diez · veinte · treinta · cuarenta · cincuenta

1. A bag of apples costs £10. Draw a line to the word 'diez'. (1 mark)

2. A punnet of strawberries costs £20. Draw a line to the word 'veinte'. (1 mark)

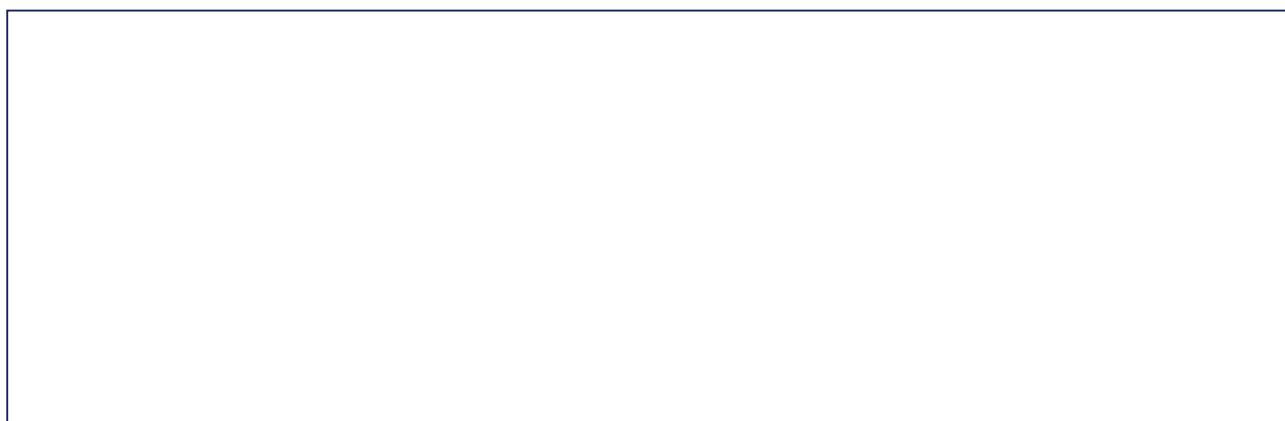
3. A bunch of carrots costs £30. Draw a line to the word 'treinta'. (1 mark)

4. A box of tomatoes costs £40. Draw a line to the word 'cuarenta'. (1 mark)

5. A jar of honey costs £50. Draw a line to the word 'cincuenta'. (1 mark)

6. Rosa sells apples (£10) and carrots (£30). What is the total in Spanish words? (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a market stall with five items on the shelves. Label each item with a price tag showing a number between 1 and 50 written as a Spanish word.



Extension challenge: Choose two new items for the market stall. Write their prices in Spanish and calculate the total cost in Spanish. Example: 'veinte' + 'diez' = 'treinta'.
