

## Rosa's Guide to Expressing Opinions in Spanish

¡Hola! Join Rosa the parrot and learn how to share what you love, like, or dislike in Spanish!

- To say you love something, use the phrase 'Me encanta'. Add a singular noun afterwards to express your passion!
- When you want to express a dislike, simply place the word 'No' before 'me gusta'.
- Using the word 'pero' allows you to contrast two different opinions in a single sentence, such as: 'Me gusta el fútbol, pero no me gusta el tenis.'
- You can add detail to your sentences by using 'porque' to explain the reasoning behind your opinion.
- If you share an opinion with a friend, you can add 'también' at the end of your sentence to mean 'me too' or 'also'.

*Did you know? Did you know? In Spanish, when you say you like something plural—like 'I like apples'—you must change the phrase to 'Me gustan las manzanas'. Rosa always remembers to add that extra 'n' whenever the object is plural!*

**Key vocabulary:** Me gusta (I like) · Me encanta (I love) · No me gusta (I do not like) · Odiar (To hate) · También (Also) · Pero (But) · Porque (Because)
