

Spanish Opinion Phrases with Rosa the Parrot

Learning objective: To learn and use Spanish opinion phrases to express likes and dislikes about school subjects and hobbies.

Read the opinion phrases in the word bank carefully. Use them to complete the sentences below. Remember to match the opinion phrase with the correct noun.

Word bank: Me gusta (I like) · No me gusta (I do not like) · Me encanta (I love) · Odio (I hate) · las matemáticas (maths) · el arte (art) · el fútbol (football) · la música (music)

1. Rosa is talking about her favourite subject. If she loves maths, which phrase should she use? Write a full sentence in Spanish. (2 marks)

2. Max the monkey does not like music. Translate 'I do not like music' into Spanish using the word bank. (2 marks)

3. Look at the phrase 'Me encanta el arte'. Explain what this means in English and why we use 'el' before 'arte'. (3 marks)

4. If you wanted to say you hate football, how would you write that in Spanish? (2 marks)

5. Create your own opinion sentence about a hobby using one of the phrases from the word bank and explain your choice in English. (3 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of Rosa the parrot holding a sign that says '¡Me encanta el español!' (I love Spanish!) and add colourful illustrations of a paintbrush, a football, and a musical note around her.



Extension challenge: Research one more school subject in Spanish (e.g., science or history) and write a short paragraph explaining your opinion on three different subjects using the phrases you have learnt today.
