

Class 5 Spanish Assessment: Mi Escuela (My School)

Learning objective: To demonstrate understanding of school subjects, classroom objects, and opinions in Spanish.

Read each question carefully. Write your answers in the spaces provided. Remember to use your knowledge of gender (masculine/feminine) when writing nouns.

Hola, soy Rosa la lora. Welcome to my school! I love my subjects, but I find some easier than others. My favourite subject is Spanish because I am a parrot, but I also enjoy maths. I carry my pencils in a blue case and my books in a big, heavy bag.

Word bank: las matemáticas (maths) · el inglés (English) · las ciencias (science) · el arte (art) · la educación física (PE) · el estuche (pencil case) · el cuaderno (notebook) · la mochila (backpack) · me gusta (I like) · no me gusta (I do not like) · es aburrido (it is boring) · es divertido (it is fun)

1. Translate the following subjects into English: 1. El arte, 2. La educación física. (2 marks)

2. If you want to say 'I like science' and 'I do not like maths', how would you write this in Spanish? (2 marks)

3. Identify the odd one out from this list and explain why in English: El cuaderno, El estuche, La mochila, El profesor. (3 marks)

4. Rosa says, 'Las matemáticas es divertido'. Is this sentence grammatically correct regarding gender agreement? Explain why or why not. (4 marks)

5. Imagine you are describing your school day. Write 4-5 sentences in Spanish using the word bank. Include which subjects you study and your opinion of them (e.g., Me gusta el arte porque es divertido). (5 marks)

6. Complete the following sentence: 'En mi mochila tengo...' (List three classroom items you might have in your bag in Spanish). (3 marks)

7. Why do we use the article 'el' before 'arte' even though it is a feminine concept in some contexts? (Hint: Think about the starting letter). (3 marks)

Draw: Draw your ideal classroom. Label at least four items in Spanish (e.g., la mesa, la silla, el libro, el lápiz).
