

A Day at the Spanish Market with Rosa

Learning objective: To identify and use Spanish vocabulary related to shopping, prices, and food items.

Help Rosa the parrot set up her market stall! Follow the steps below to draw your market scene and use the word bank to label the items in Spanish.

Draw: Draw a colourful Spanish market scene. In the centre, draw Rosa the parrot standing behind a wooden stall. On the stall, include a basket of fruit, a loaf of bread, and a small sign showing a price in pounds (£). In the background, draw a bright sun and a simple building representing 'la tienda'. Ensure there is space around the items to add your Spanish labels clearly.



Label words: la fruta (fruit) · el pan (bread) · la tienda (the shop) · ¿Cuánto cuesta? (How much does it cost?) · dos libras (two pounds) · la moneda (the coin)

Steps:

1. Draw a basket containing three apples. Label the apples 'las manzanas' in Spanish.
2. Rosa is holding a sign with a price on it. Write '£3.50' on the sign in your drawing.
3. If a customer asks '¿Cuánto cuesta?', what are they asking in English?
4. Draw two coins near the basket and label them 'las monedas'.
5. Write a short sentence in Spanish to describe one item in your shop, for example: 'El pan cuesta una

libra.'
