Learning objective: To be able to tell and write the time in Spanish using the 12-hour clock format, including o'clock, quarter past, half past, and quarter to.

1. 1. Rosa starts her breakfast at 1:00. Write the Spanish phrase: _____ (2 marks)

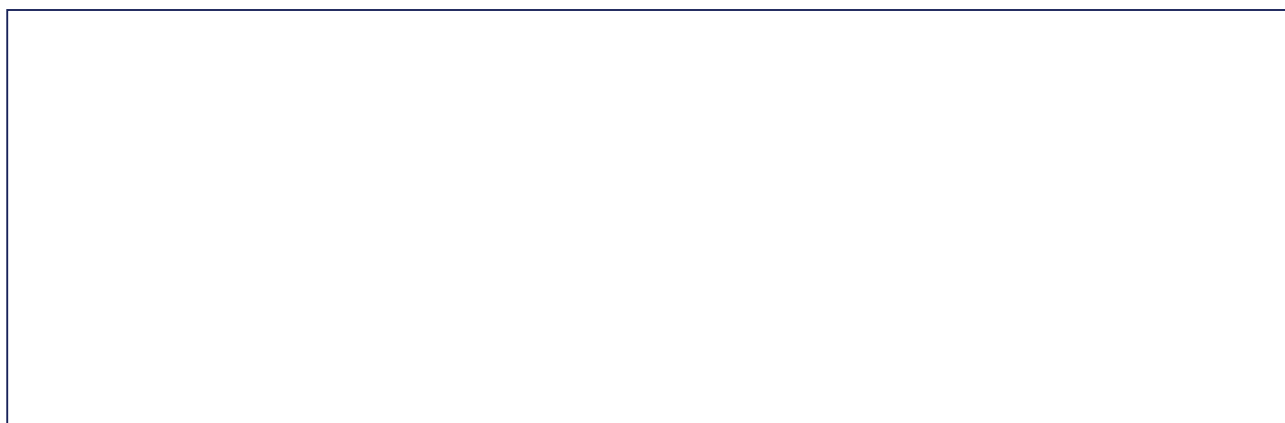
2. 2. Rosa practices her flying at 2:15. Write the Spanish phrase: _____ (2 marks)
