

Sheet 15: Joining Sentences

Worked example:

Pip likes books. Pip likes reading. (Join with 'and')

Answer: Pip likes books and Pip likes reading.

- **Join these sentences using 'and', 'but', or 'so'.**

1. Max is happy. Max found a puzzle. (Use 'and') 2. Nova wanted to fly. It was too dark. (Use 'but') 3. Ellie was hungry. She ate an apple. (Use 'so')

- **Finish the sentence about Zara using 'but'.**

Zara wanted to paint a picture, but...

- **Finish the sentence about Finn using 'so'.**

The sea was very calm, so...

- **Circle the joining word in this sentence: Leo roared loudly and the birds flew away.**
