

Zara's Abstract Art Adventure

Learning objective: To understand that abstract art uses shapes, colours, and lines instead of drawing real things.

Zara the Zebra loves patterns! Look at the shapes and lines below. Follow the instructions to create your own abstract art. Use a pencil or coloured pens to fill the boxes.

Word bank: Abstract · Shape · Pattern · Colour · Line

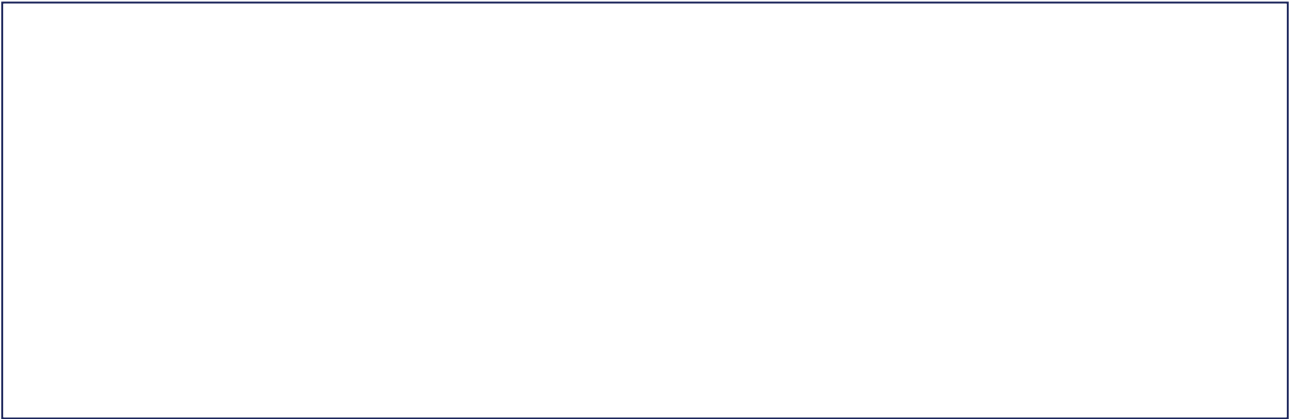
1. 1. Zara wants you to draw three different types of lines in this box (e.g., wavy, zig-zag, or straight). (2 marks)

2. 2. In this box, draw a circle, a square, and a triangle overlapping each other. What new shapes do you see inside? (2 marks)

3. 3. Abstract art uses colours to show feelings. Choose two colours and fill this box with a pattern using only those colours. (2 marks)

4. 4. Why is your drawing 'abstract'? Use the word bank to help you write one sentence. (2 marks)

Draw: Create a piece of abstract art in the space below. Do not draw a real object like a house or a cat. Instead, use only lines, dots, and geometric shapes to fill the whole page.



Extension challenge: Look at your drawing. If you were to sell this in an art gallery, how much would it cost? Write a price tag for your masterpiece in pounds and pence, for example, £5.50.
