- In what ways can layering 'translucent' paints create the effect of light shining through changing leaves?
- How does the 'contrast' between a grey, misty sky and a bright orange pumpkin change the mood of an artwork?
- Can you spot the 'symmetry' in a fallen leaf, and how might you replicate that balance in a printmaking project?

Did you know? Did you know? The brilliant reds and oranges we see in autumn leaves are actually hidden in the leaf all summer long! They are masked by the green chlorophyll until the days get shorter and the tree stops producing it, revealing the hidden 'autumnal fire' beneath.
