

Year 4 Christmas Art Flashcards

Learning objective: To identify and explain key artistic techniques and materials used for Christmas-themed crafts.

Read the front of the card. Think about the answer. Flip the card to check if you are right. Use the word bank to help you.

What is a Collage?

A piece of art made by sticking different materials like paper, fabric, or leaves onto a flat surface.

What is Symmetry?

When both sides of a pattern or picture are exactly the same, like a snowflake.

What is a Primary colour?

A colour that cannot be made by mixing others. These are red, yellow, and blue.

What does Texture mean?

The way a surface feels or looks like it would feel, such as rough, smooth, or bumpy.

What is a Sketch?

A quick, light drawing used to plan an idea before making a final piece of art.

What is Clay?

A soft material from the earth used to mould 3D shapes like Christmas tree decorations.

What is a Pattern?

A design that repeats over and over again, often used on wrapping paper.

What is Tone in art?

How light or dark a colour is. Using dark and light green makes a tree look real.

What is a Medium?

The materials an artist uses to create their work, such as paint, pencils, or glitter.

Why do we use Gold and Silver?

These are metallic colours often used in Christmas art to represent light and sparkle.
