- **Using warm colours like red, gold, and orange helps your art feel cosy and bright during the dark winter days.**
- **You can add texture to your festive pictures by using different materials like glitter, cotton wool for snow, or shiny foil.**
- **Repeating shapes in a line creates a pattern. Try making a border of stars or baubles around the edge of your drawing.**
- **Contrast means using opposite colours to make parts of your art pop out, such as white snow against a dark blue night sky.**
