- **Symmetry is a key element of Easter art; try folding your paper in half to ensure your patterns are perfectly balanced on both sides.**
- **Using a vibrant colour palette—such as mixing warm yellows and bright pinks—can help your artwork capture the feeling of spring.**
- **Textural details, like adding raised dots with glue or using cross-hatching with pens, make a flat drawing look more three-dimensional.**
- **Geometric shapes like triangles, diamonds, and spirals are excellent for filling negative space in your designs.**
- **Consider the 'Rule of Thirds' when placing your main subject on the page to make your composition more professional and eye-catching.**
