

Zara's Guide to Perspective

Master the Magic of Making Art Pop!

- The horizon line is the place where the earth meets the sky.
- Objects in the foreground are drawn larger to look closer to us.
- Objects in the background are drawn smaller to look further away.
- Lines that look like they go into the distance are called receding lines.
- Perspective helps us create the illusion of depth on a flat piece of paper.

Did you know? Did you know? Artists use a special trick called a 'vanishing point'. It is a tiny dot on the horizon line where all lines seem to meet. This makes your drawings look like you can step right into them!
