

Year 4 Art: World Book Day Creative Techniques

Learning objective: To learn art techniques used to create book covers and character illustrations.

Read the front of the flashcard to see the art term. Think about what it means. Flip the card to check the answer. Use the word bank if you need help.

What is an Illustration?

A drawing or painting that shows a story or idea from a book.

What is a Sketch?

A quick, light drawing used to plan out an idea before adding detail.

What is a Portrait?

A piece of art that shows the face or body of a character.

What is a Collage?

Making art by sticking different materials like paper or fabric onto a flat surface.

What is Texture?

How a surface looks or feels, such as rough, smooth, or bumpy.

What is Composition?

The way objects or characters are placed on the page to look balanced.

What are Primary Colours?

The three main colours you cannot make by mixing others: red, yellow, and blue.

What is Tone?

How light or dark a colour is, used to show shadows and shape.

What is a Pattern?

A design that repeats shapes or lines to make art look interesting.

What is the Foreground?

The part of the picture that looks closest to the viewer.

Who is Pip?
