- An algorithm is a precise set of step-by-step instructions designed to complete a specific task or solve a problem.
- Sequencing is the order in which commands are executed; if one step is out of place, the entire programme might fail.
- Debugging is the detective work of computing: it is the process of finding and fixing errors in your code so the programme runs smoothly.
- Selection allows a computer to make a choice, often using 'if' or 'else' statements to decide which path to follow based on data.
- Iteration, also known as looping, tells the computer to repeat a specific section of code until a certain condition is met.

Did you know? Did you know? The first computer programmer was a mathematician named Ada Lovelace, who wrote the very first algorithm intended for a machine way back in the 1840s—long before modern computers even existed!
