

Kit's Spreadsheet Shop

Learning objective: To understand how a spreadsheet uses rows, columns, and cells to organise data.

Kit the fox is helping a local market stall track their fruit sales. Look at the grid below. Match the labels to the correct parts of the spreadsheet. Use the word bank to help you.

Word bank: Column · Row · Cell · Data

1. 1. What do we call the vertical line of boxes going up and down? (Hint: It starts with C) (1 mark)

2. 2. What do we call the horizontal line of boxes going across? (Hint: It starts with R) (1 mark)

3. 3. What is the name for one single box where a row and column meet? (1 mark)

4. 4. If an apple costs £1, and we sell 5, what do we call the number '5' that we type into the box? (1 mark)

Draw: Draw a simple grid of 3 rows and 3 columns. Put a small apple in the top-left box (cell).



Extension challenge: Imagine you are selling items at a shop. Write down three things you would sell and how much each costs in pounds (£).
