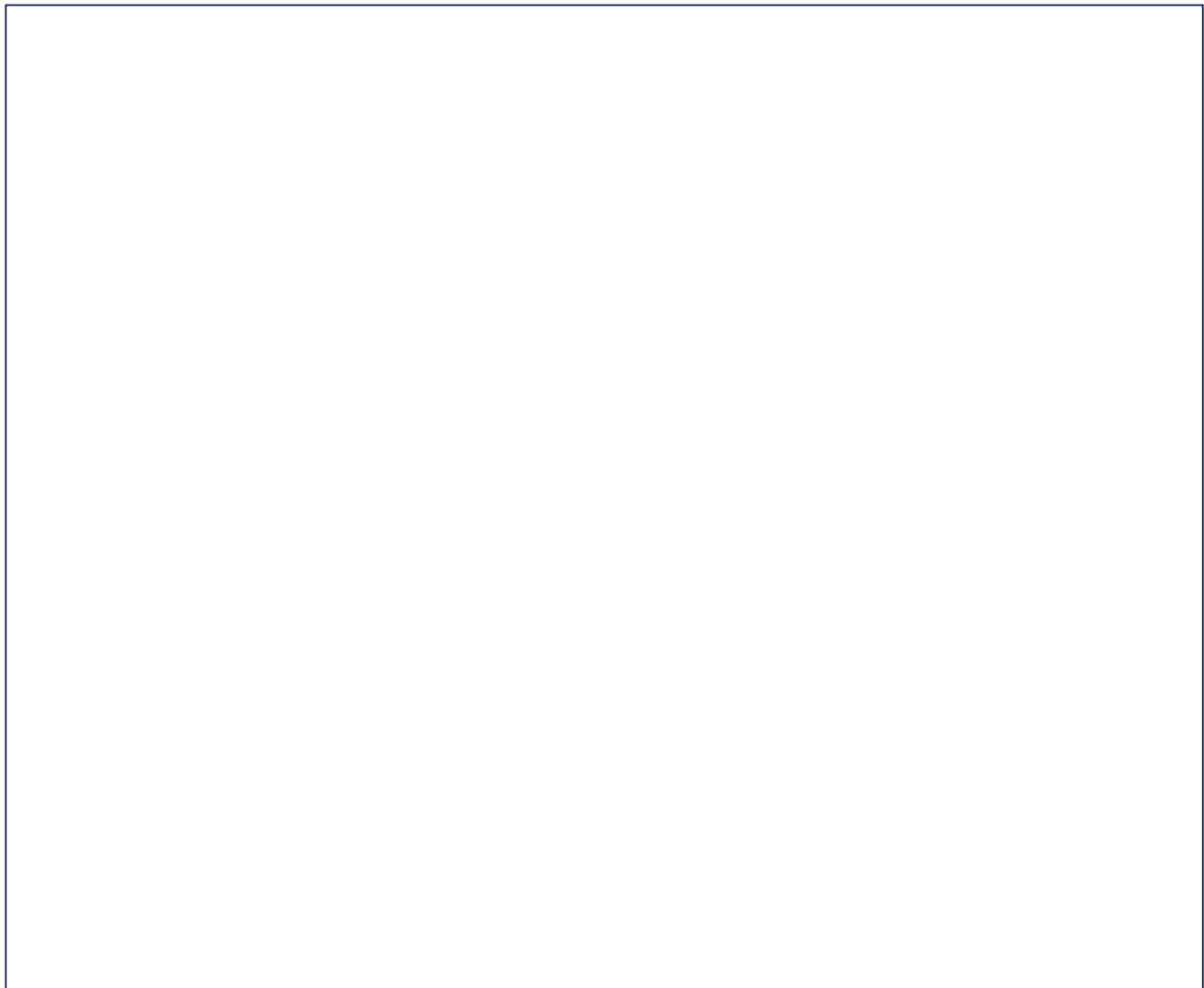


Zara's Magical Art Studio

Learning objective: To use a range of adjectives to describe objects and improve writing.

Zara the Zebra loves to paint, but she needs help describing her studio! Follow the steps below to draw her studio and label it using the most exciting adjectives you can think of.

Draw: Draw Zara the Zebra standing in the middle of her art studio. Include: 1) A large, rectangular canvas on an easel, 2) A table with pots of paint, 3) A window showing a sunny garden. Make sure to draw at least five items in the room. Use your pencil to label each item with an adjective from the word bank (e.g., draw a brush and label it 'tiny brush').



Label words: sparkly · enormous · colourful · soft · dusty · bright · tiny · smooth

Steps:

1. Choose one object from your drawing. Write a full sentence using two adjectives to describe it. For example: 'The enormous, colourful painting is on the wall.'
2. Why do we use adjectives when we describe our drawings to others?
3. Look at the word 'sparkly'. Can you write a different adjective that means the same thing?
4. Draw a 'tiny' detail in the corner of your page. What is it?
5. If Zara's studio was 'messy', what might we see on the floor? List two items.
