Learning objective: To identify and use adverbs to modify verbs, adjectives, or other adverbs, understanding how they add detail and precision to writing.

Read the passage below carefully. Answer the questions in full sentences, ensuring you look for the adverbs that describe how, when, or where actions are taking place.

Max the monkey was busily preparing for the school summer fair. He wanted his stall to be absolutely perfect. He meticulously organised his jars of marbles, placing them in rows of five. 1. Find two adverbs in the text that describe how Max interacted with his customers or his work. (2 marks)

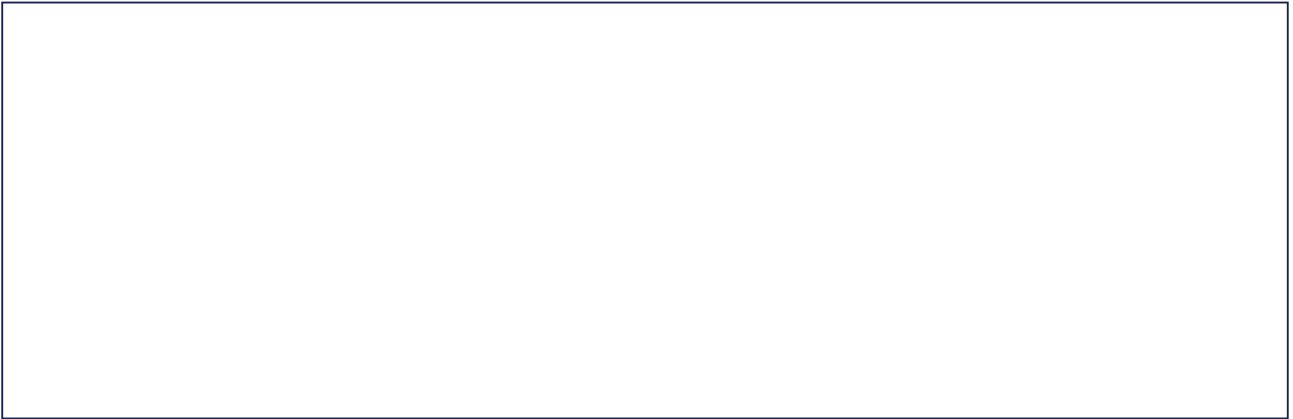
2. What was the maximum price of an item at Max's stall? (1 mark)

4. Based on the text, how does Pip feel about Max's preparation for the fair? (2 marks)

5. Do you think Max is a good shopkeeper? Use evidence from the text to justify your opinion. (3 marks)
