

Mastering Adverbs with Max the Monkey

Learning objective: To identify, understand, and use adverbs to modify verbs, adjectives, and other adverbs.

Read the front of the card to see the task or term. Think of the answer before flipping to the back to check your knowledge with Max's help.

What is the definition of an adverb?

A word that modifies a verb, an adjective, or another adverb, often describing how, when, where, or to what extent something happens.

Identify the adverb in this sentence: 'Max quickly solved the maths puzzle.'

quickly

Which type of adverb tells us how an action is performed (e.g., softly, loudly, carefully)?

Adverb of manner.

Fill in the blank: 'Pip read the book _____. ' (Use an adverb of manner)

Examples include: silently, eagerly, happily, quickly.

Which type of adverb tells us how often something happens (e.g., always, never, sometimes)?

Adverb of frequency.

Identify the adverb of time in this sentence: 'Zara painted her canvas yesterday.'

yesterday

Complete the sentence with an adverb of degree: 'Nova was _____ tired after stargazing all night.'

Examples include: very, extremely, quite, rather.

Which type of adverb tells us where an action takes place (e.g., here, there, everywhere)?

Adverb of place.

Is the underlined word an adverb in this sentence? 'Finn swam in the deep ocean.'

No. 'Deep' is an adjective here because it describes the noun 'ocean'.

Turn the adjective 'brave' into an adverb.

bravely

Turn the adjective 'gentle' into an adverb.

gently

Create a sentence using the adverb 'frequently'.

Example: Bea the bee frequently visits the colourful flowers in the garden.
