1. The rocket _____ into the dark sky with a trail of gold stars. (2 marks)

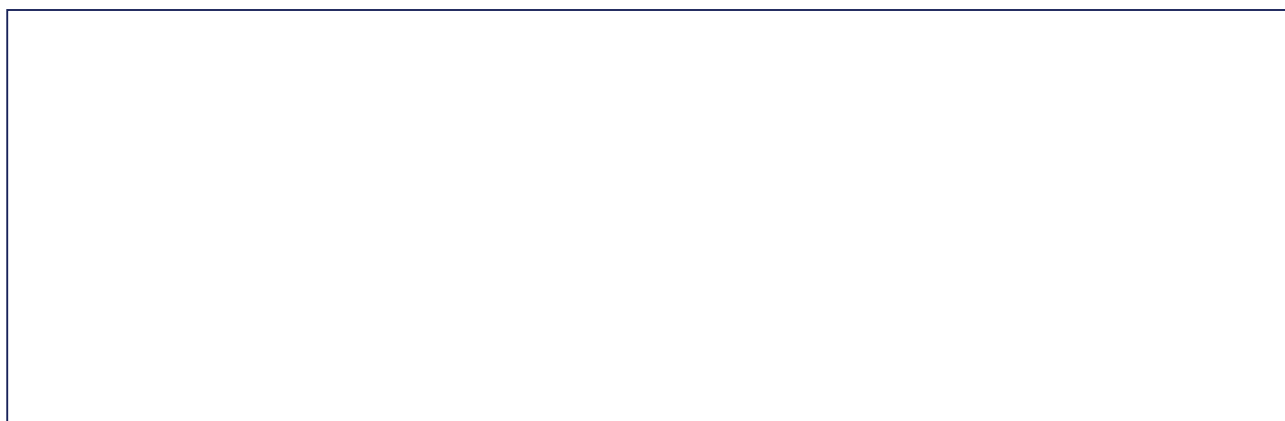
2. A _____ firework exploded, making a loud sound that _____ across the field. (2 marks)
