Learning objective: To learn key vocabulary and facts about Bonfire Night and the history of the 5th of November.

Read the front of the card. Try to say the answer out loud. Then, flip the card (read the answer) to check if you are right. Max the Monkey says, 'Let's solve these puzzles together!'

When is Bonfire Night held?

5th November.

What do we call the big outdoor fires lit on this night?

A bonfire.

Who was the man caught under the Houses of Parliament?

Guy Fawkes.

What do we call the loud, colourful lights in the sky?

Fireworks.

What is the name of the place where the King meets his helpers?

Parliament.

What is a small, handheld wire that sparkles when lit?

A sparkler.

Is it safe to play with fireworks without an adult?

No, never.

What does the word 'history' mean?

Things that happened in the past.

What should you wear to stay warm at a bonfire?

A warm coat, scarf and gloves.

What is a 'plot' in a story or history?

A secret plan to do something.

Why do we have fireworks today?

To remember the events of 1605.
