

Writing a Book Review with Pip the Caterpillar

Learning objective: To learn how to write a simple review about a book you have read.

Read each question carefully. Use the word bank to help you spell tricky words. Fill in the boxes with your own ideas about a book you enjoyed.

Pip the caterpillar is reading a new story! To write a great review, you need to tell people what the book is about, who the best character is, and why you liked it. Remember, your review is your own opinion.

2. Who is your favourite character in the book? Why do you like them? (2 marks)

3. Write one sentence to describe what happens in the story. (Sentence starter: In this story...) (2 marks)

4. Would you tell a friend to read this book? Why or why not? (2 marks)
