

Character Description: My New Friend

Learning objective: To use adjectives and expanded noun phrases to describe a character's appearance and personality.

Today, we are going to write a description of a character. Look at the prompts below and use the word bank to help you. Use short sentences to describe what your character looks like and what they are like inside. Remember to use a capital letter at the start of every sentence.

Word bank: cheerful · kind · brave · spotted · fluffy · bright · gentle · tall · small · friendly · curly · shiny

1. Name your character and say what they look like. (Sentence starter: My character is called... They have...) (2 marks)

2. Describe the clothes or colours your character wears. (Sentence starter: They are wearing... The colours are...) (2 marks)

3. What is your character like? Are they kind or funny? (Sentence starter: My character is very... They like to...) (2 marks)

4. Where does your character live? (Sentence starter: They live in a...) (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of your character in the box below. Make sure to draw the clothes and colours you described in your writing.



Extension challenge: Can you add one sentence using the word 'because' to explain why your character is kind? For example: 'My character is kind because they share their snacks.'
