1. Max the monkey is busy solving a complex maths puzzle. Write an expanded noun phrase to describe his clever, nimble fingers as he works. (2 marks)

2. Nova the owl is watching the night sky. Instead of saying 'the owl looked at the moon', write a sentence using a metaphor to describe the moon and a verb to describe how she watches it. (2 marks)

3. Ellie the elephant has a wonderful memory. Use two adjectives from the word bank to describe her personality and write a sentence explaining how she uses her memory to help others. (3 marks)

4. Zara the zebra is painting a masterpiece. Describe her art studio using at least two sensory details (sight, sound, or smell). (3 marks)

5. Kit the fox has just solved a tricky computing puzzle. Write a short paragraph (3-4 sentences) describing his reaction using 'show, don't tell' techniques (e.g., instead of saying he is happy, describe his tail wagging or his ears perking up). (4 marks)
