Learning objective: To retrieve information from a text and make simple inferences about characters and events.

Read the story carefully and answer the questions below in full sentences.

1. What did Max the monkey buy from the market and how much did he spend in total? (2 marks)

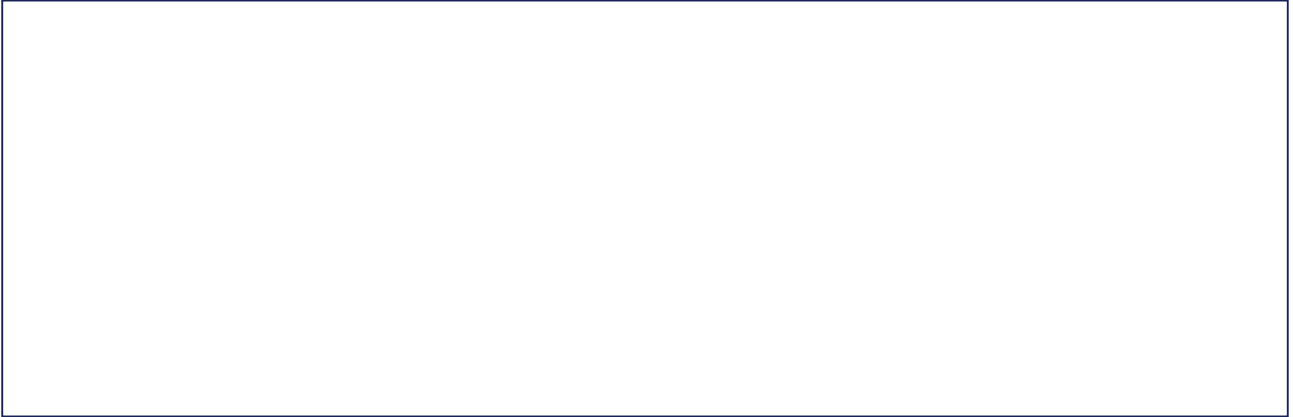
2. Where does the story take place? (1 mark)
