Learning objective: To read a short narrative text and answer comprehension questions, focusing on retrieval and inference.

Read the story about Leo the Lion below. Think about how the characters feel and what happens in the story. Answer the questions in the spaces provided.

When he opened it, he found Bea the honeybee shivering in the cold. She had been collecting late-blooming winter flowers and got caught in a snowstorm. 1. Where was Leo the Lion when he heard the knock at the door? (1 mark)

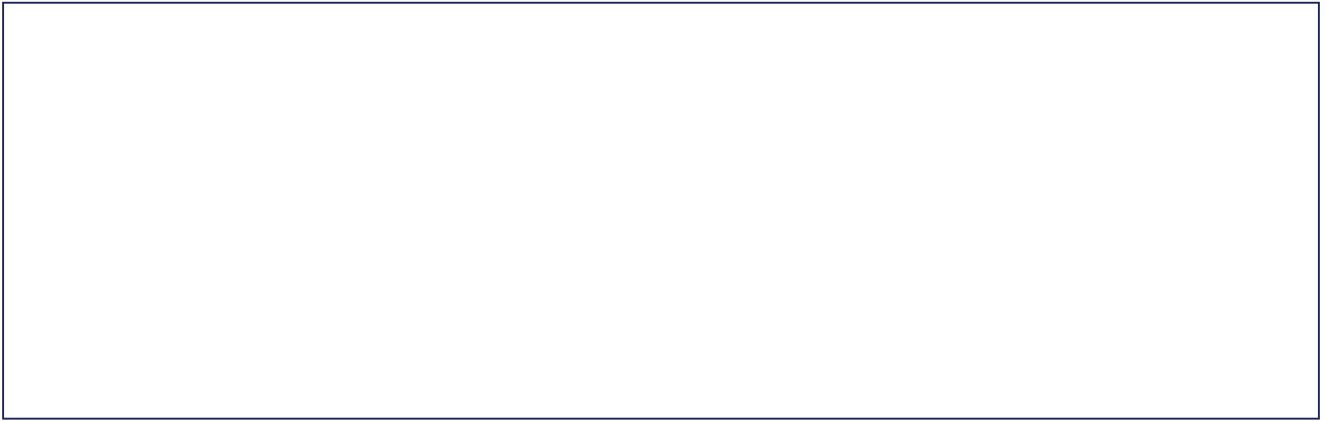
2. Why was Bea the honeybee outside in the cold? (1 mark)

4. How do you know that Leo is a kind friend? Use evidence from the story. (2 marks)

5. What does the author mean by the phrase 'the most perfect Christmas gift of all'? (2 marks)
