

A Snowy Surprise at the BookFlik Library

Learning objective: To use descriptive language and sequence events to write a short, imaginative Christmas story.

Read the questions carefully. Use your best handwriting and remember to include capital letters and full stops in your sentences.

Pip the caterpillar and Max the monkey are decorating the library for Christmas. They have found a box of shiny baubles, some colourful tinsel, and a very large, mysterious gift wrapped in gold paper. They need your help to finish their story!

1. Pip wants to describe the library tree. Write two adjectives from the word bank that could describe how the tree looks. (2 marks)

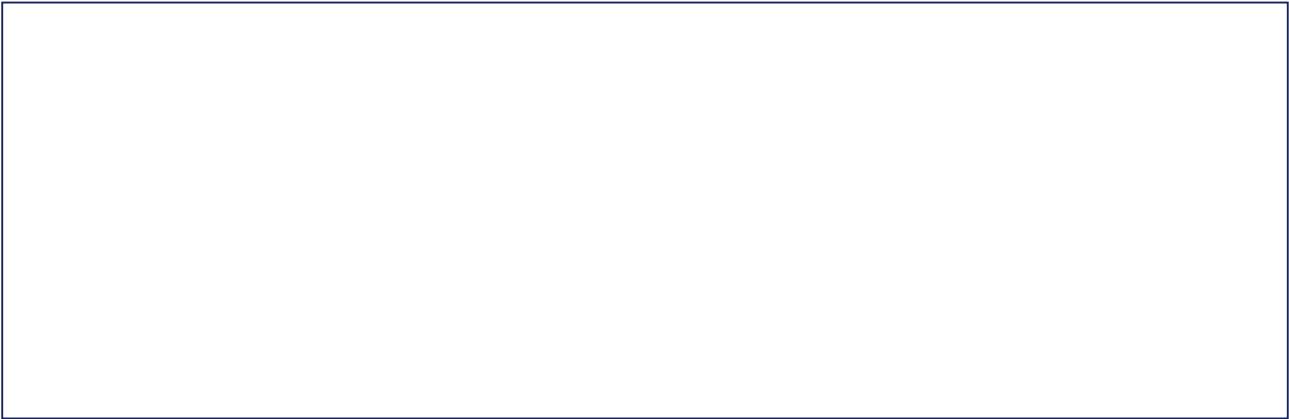
2. Max thinks the mysterious gift is a maths puzzle. What do you think is inside the gift? Write a full sentence. (2 marks)

3. The library is holding a Christmas party. If a book costs £3 and a bookmark costs £1, how much would it cost for Pip to buy one of each? (2 marks)

4. Write a sentence explaining why Pip and Max are feeling happy today. (2 marks)

5. Think of an exciting ending for the story. Where does the gold gift come from? (3 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of Pip the caterpillar and Max the monkey decorating the Christmas tree in the library. Make sure to draw the mysterious gold gift underneath!
