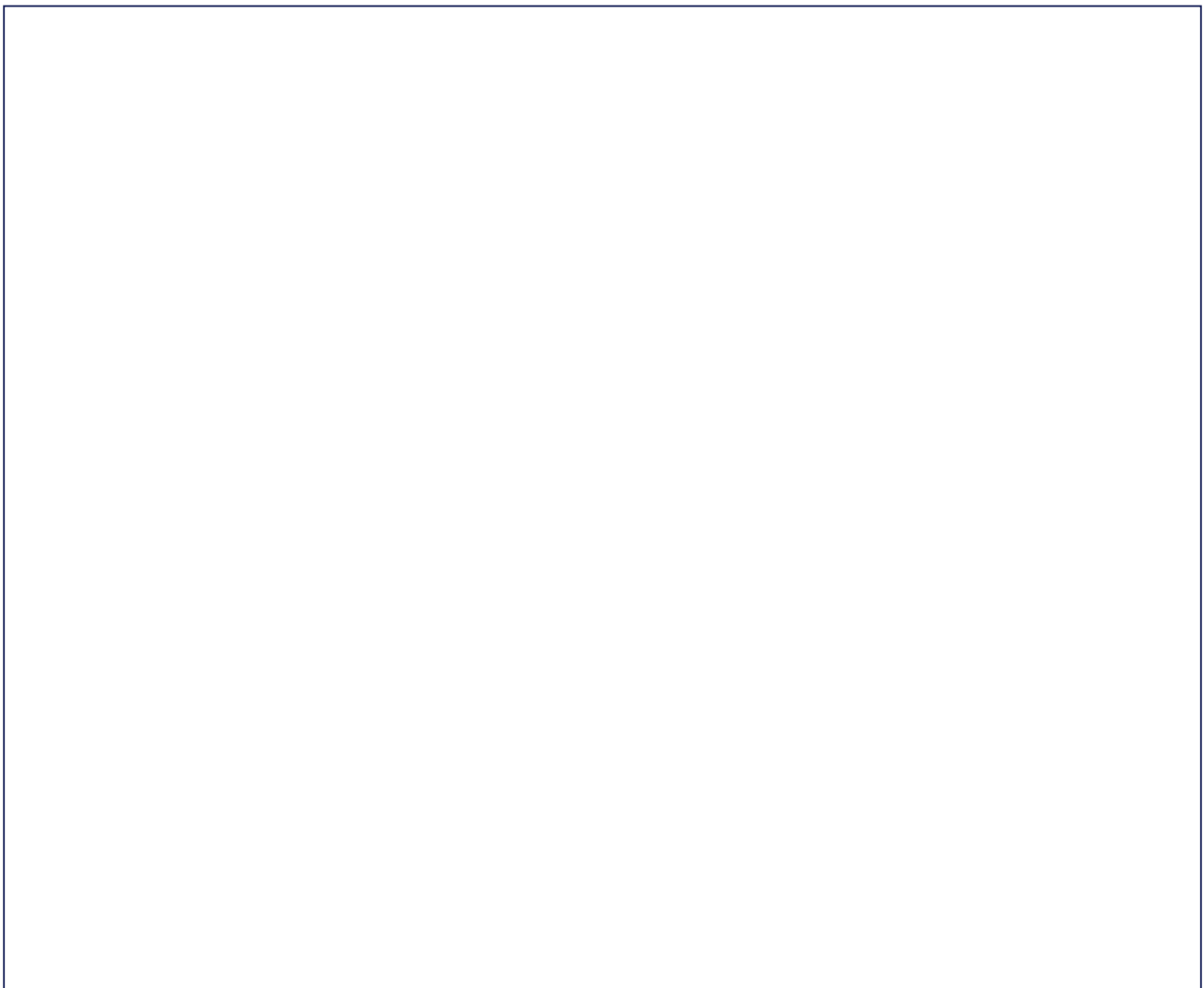


The Christmas Eve Adventure: A Storyboard Challenge

Learning objective: To use descriptive language and visual planning to structure a narrative, focusing on setting the scene and character motivation.

Use your imagination to create a storyboard for a Christmas story featuring Pip the bookworm caterpillar. Follow the steps below to design your scene and answer the reflection questions to help develop your plot.

Draw: Draw a scene featuring Pip the caterpillar in a large, old-fashioned library decorated for Christmas. The style should be detailed and whimsical. Include a large, decorated tree in the background with glowing lights, a pile of dusty books, and Pip holding a small, wrapped parcel. Use soft colours to represent the glow of the Christmas lights against the dark, wooden shelves.



Label words: festive · shimmering · cozy · enchanted · anticipation · frosty · starry · twinkling · mysterious · heartwarming

Steps:

1. Describe the setting of your drawing using at least two adjectives from the word bank to create a festive atmosphere.
2. What is the 'special gift' that Pip is hiding? Describe its appearance.
3. Why is Pip feeling a sense of 'anticipation'? Explain his motivation for this secret mission.

4. Label the most important object in your drawing that represents the Christmas theme.
5. If Pip were to encounter a challenge while hiding his gift, what might it be? (e.g., a cold breeze or a noisy shelf).
