

Max and Kit's Punctuation Puzzle

Learning objective: To correctly identify and use colons and semicolons to link independent clauses and introduce lists.

Max the monkey and Kit the fox have been busy writing! Help them fix their sentences by choosing the correct punctuation. Answer all 10 questions to earn your punctuation badge.

Answer Key: 1. A, 2. B, 3. True, 4. Semicolon, 5. C, 6. False, 7. Colon, 8. B, 9. True, 10. Semicolon.

(Teacher Note: A semicolon separates two related independent clauses. A colon introduces a list or an explanation.)

6. 6. True or False: You should always use a colon to join two short, simple sentences together. (1 mark)

7. 7. What punctuation mark is used in this sentence: 'Kit had one goal: to finish the coding project.'? (1 mark)

8. 8. Choose the correct option to complete: 'I have three favourite subjects ____ maths, English and science.' A) ; B) :* C) , D) . (1 mark)

9. 9. True or False: A semicolon acts like a 'soft' full stop, showing that the two sentences are linked. (1 mark)

10. 10. Which punctuation mark is best for separating two long, balanced sentences? (Colon or Semicolon) (1 mark)
