- A conjunction is a special word that joins two parts of a sentence together.
- We use 'and' to add more information, like: Max ate a banana and he peeled it first.
- We use 'but' to show a change, like: Max wanted to climb the tree but it was too tall.
- We use 'because' to explain why, like: Max was happy because he solved the maths puzzle.
- We use 'so' to show what happened next, like: It started to rain so Max ran home.
- Remember: Always check that your new, joined sentence still makes sense!
