

Creative Writing Adventure with Pip the Bookworm

Learning objective: To understand and apply key creative writing techniques including adjectives, verbs, and sentence structure.

Read the front of each flashcard to learn a new writing tip. Use these cards to help you write a magical story about an adventure in the forest.

What is an Adjective?

An adjective is a describing word that tells us more about a noun (e.g., the fluffy, brown bear).

What is a Verb?

A verb is an action word or a 'doing' word (e.g., jump, whisper, sprint).

What is a Noun?

A noun is a person, place, or thing (e.g., Pip, forest, book).

What is Alliteration?

When two or more words close together start with the same sound (e.g., the brave, bright butterfly).

What is a Conjunction?

A word used to join two sentences together, like 'and', 'but', or 'because'.

What is a Fronted Adverbial?

A word or phrase at the start of a sentence that tells us when, where, or how something happens (e.g., 'Suddenly, the owl flew').

What is a Setting?

The place where a story happens (e.g., a sandy beach or a dark, mysterious cave).

Why do we use capital letters?

To start every sentence and for proper nouns like names of people or places.

How do you finish a sentence?

By using a full stop (.), an exclamation mark (!), or a question mark (?).

What is a Character?

A person, animal, or creature in a story who helps the plot move forward.
