

## Zara's Colourful Canvas of Words

*Learning objective: To develop reading comprehension skills by identifying descriptive language and inferring character motivations in a narrative text.*

Read the story about Zara the zebra carefully, then answer the questions that follow in full sentences.

Zara the zebra stood in the middle of her meadow, holding a sketchbook and a set of bright pencils. While other animals were busy gathering nuts or building nests, Zara was busy hunting for magic in the ordinary. She watched the way the sunlight danced through the oak leaves, creating dappled patterns on the grass. To Zara, the world was not just a place to live; it was a giant, unfinished painting.

She scribbled a description in her notebook: 'The sky is a soft blanket of periwinkle blue, tucked around the shoulders of the hills.' Zara loved using words to capture the things she saw. 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**4. How does Zara feel about the world around her compared to the other animals? (2 marks)**

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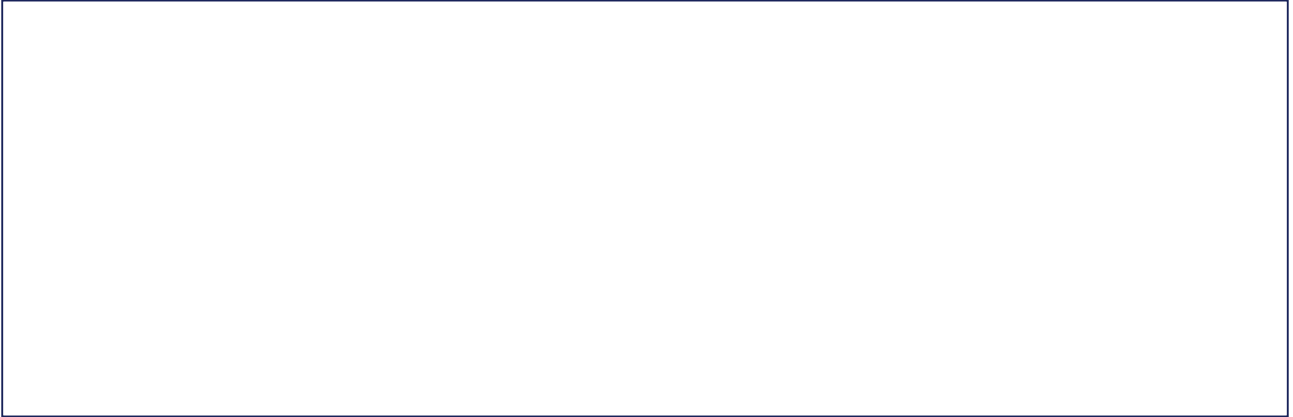
**5. Do you think Zara is a good writer? Explain why using evidence from the text. (2 marks)**
