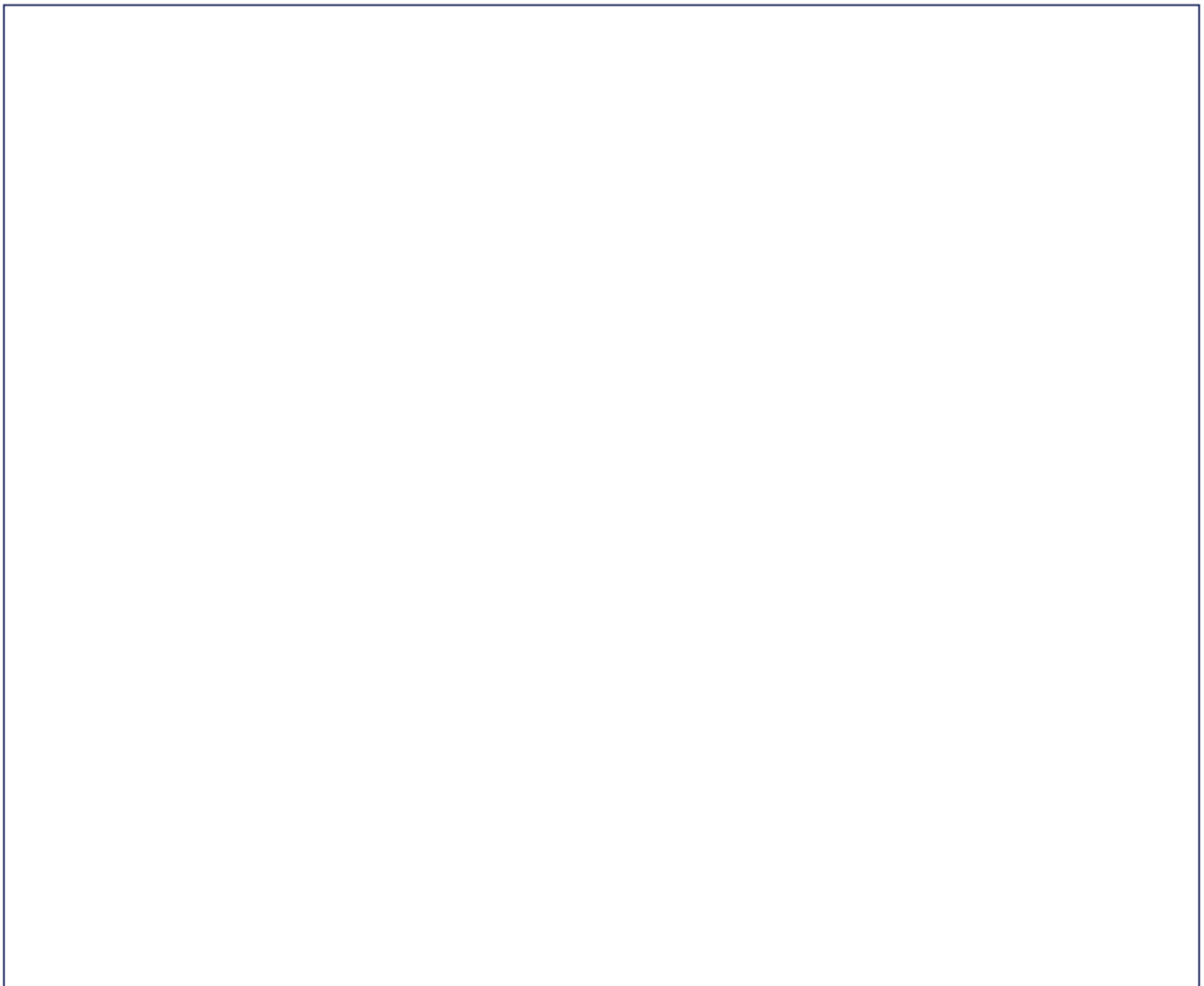


Diary Daydreams with Pip

Learning objective: To use descriptive language to plan a diary entry by visualising a scene.

Pip the caterpillar is writing a diary about his busy day. Follow the steps below to draw your own diary scene. Use the word bank to help you label your drawing.

Draw: Draw a large, clear picture of Pip the caterpillar in the centre of the page. Use a 'story-time' style with bright, cheerful colours. Include Pip in a cozy spot, such as under a big leaf. Add details like a small book or a yummy leaf for him to eat. Make sure there is plenty of space around your drawing to add labels from the word bank.



Label words: sunshine · favourite book · tasty leaf · cozy nook · happy · excited

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw Pip sitting in his favourite cozy nook. Where is he sitting? (e.g., on a big green leaf or a wooden branch).
2. Step 2: Draw one thing Pip is holding. Is it his favourite book or a tasty snack?
3. Step 3: Label your drawing using two words from the word bank to show how Pip is feeling.
4. Step 4: Draw one detail in the background, like the bright sunshine or a pretty flower.
