

Max's Maths Adventure: Fronted Adverbials

Learning objective: To identify and use fronted adverbials to describe when or how an action happens.

Max the monkey is solving a puzzle! A fronted adverbial tells us when or how something happens. It goes at the start of the sentence, followed by a comma. Match the start of the sentence to the correct ending to help Max finish his maths puzzle.

Word bank: Carefully, · Every morning, · Quietly, · Suddenly, · After the lesson,

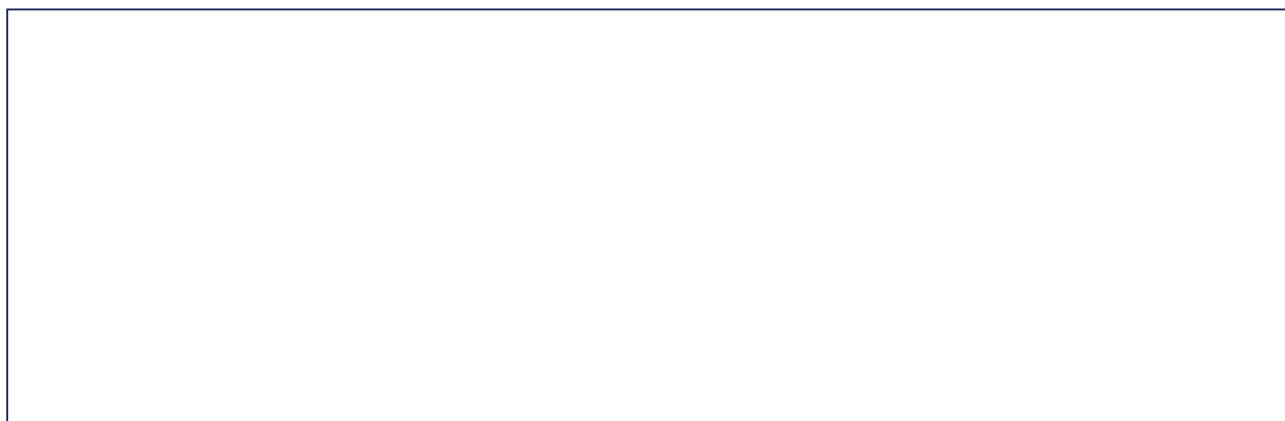
1. 1. Match the fronted adverbial to the sentence: _____ Max counted his gold coins. (2 marks)
