- A fronted adverbial is a word or phrase placed at the beginning of a sentence to describe the action.
- You must always place a comma after the fronted adverbial to separate it from the rest of your sentence.
- Use a 'Time' adverbial to show when: 'Yesterday, Max climbed a tree.'
- Use a 'Place' adverbial to show where: 'In the jungle, the monkeys played.'
- Use a 'Manner' adverbial to show how: 'Quietly, the monkey crept forward.'

Did you know? Did you know? A fronted adverbial is like a spotlight at the start of a sentence. It tells the reader when, where, or how something happens before the main action starts!
