Master the Mechanics: Build Better Sentences with Max!

- A noun is a naming word for a person, place, or thing. For example: Max the monkey, a forest, or a banana.
- An adjective describes a noun. It adds colour and detail to your writing, like 'the fuzzy monkey' or 'a bright, yellow banana'.
- A verb is a doing or being word. It tells us what is happening, such as 'Max climbs', 'he eats', or 'he is happy'.
- An adverb describes how a verb is done. They often end in '-ly', like 'Max climbed quickly' or 'he ate hungrily'.
- A conjunction joins words or sentences together. Use words like 'and', 'but', 'or', or 'because' to link your ideas.

Did you know? Did you know? The word 'grammar' comes from an ancient Greek word that meant 'the art of letters'. Every time you write a sentence, you are using the same tools that storytellers have used for thousands of years!
