

Mastering Modal Verbs with Max the Monkey

- **Modal verbs express how likely something is to happen. Use 'might' or 'could' when you are not sure about an outcome.**
- **Use 'must' or 'shall' when you are talking about an obligation or something that is necessary to complete.**
- **When you are describing a skill or talent, use 'can' or 'could' to show someone has the ability to do it.**
- **To ask for or give permission, use 'may' or 'can' to show you are being polite and clear.**
- **Always place your modal verb directly before the main verb, such as 'Max can climb' or 'We should read'.**

Did you know? Did you know? Modal verbs are like 'shape-shifters' for sentences! They don't change their form when you change the subject (you don't add an 's' to them), but they completely change the tone of what you are saying, from a tiny 'might' to a giant 'must'!
