

Learning About Reports with Nova the Owl

Learning objective: To identify the features of a non-chronological report.

Read the report about the Moon below. Then, use the word bank to help you answer the questions. Write your answers clearly on the lines.

The Moon. The Moon is a big rock that orbits the Earth. It does not have its own light. Surface of the Moon. The Moon has many craters. These are round holes on the surface. Scientists have studied these for years. (Picture of the Moon with labels).

2. What do we call the smaller titles like 'Surface of the Moon'? (1 mark)

3. Find one fact about the Moon from the report. Write it here. (2 marks)

4. Why do we use a diagram in a report? (2 marks)
