

Writing a Non-Chronological Report with Max the Monkey

Learning objective: To identify and use the features of a non-chronological report.

Max the Monkey is writing a report about his home in the jungle. Help him finish his work. Use the word bank to help you.

A non-chronological report gives information about a topic. It does not follow a specific time order. It uses clear sections to help the reader learn new things.

Word bank: Heading · Sub-heading · Fact · Paragraph · Photograph · Caption

1. Max needs a title for his report. Which of these is a good heading for a report about jungle life? Circle one: A) My Day Out / B) All About the Tropical Jungle (1 mark)

2. What do we call the small titles used to break the report into smaller sections? (1 mark)

3. Max wants to add a picture of a tree. What is the short sentence under a picture that explains what it shows called? (1 mark)

4. Write one true fact about a monkey. Start your sentence with: Monkeys are... (2 marks)

5. Why do we use paragraphs in a report? Tick one: A) To tell a story / B) To group related information together. (1 mark)

Draw: Draw a picture of a jungle animal and write a 'Caption' underneath it, just like Max would do in his report.



Extension challenge: Choose an animal you like. Write one sub-heading and two sentences of facts about it.
