Learning objective: To identify persuasive language techniques in a short text.

Read the text carefully. Use the word bank to help you understand the tricky words. Answer the questions in the boxes provided.

Max the monkey has a brilliant plan! He wants our class to visit the Deep Blue Aquarium. Max says, 'It is the most wonderful place on Earth! You will see colourful fish and clever dolphins swimming in the clear water. Everyone knows that seeing things in real life is much better than reading a book. Don't you want to be an explorer? 1. How much does the aquarium trip cost per person? (1 mark)

2. What two animals does Max mention we might see at the aquarium? (2 marks)

3. Why does Max think we deserve to go on this trip? (2 marks)

4. Why is Max using exciting words like 'spectacular' and 'wonderful'? (2 marks)

5. Do you think Max's letter would make a teacher want to go? Explain why. (3 marks)
