

Max the Monkey's Punctuation Puzzle

Learning objective: To correctly identify and use inverted commas (speech marks) to punctuate direct speech in accordance with Year 5 English standards.

Max the Monkey is trying to organise his jungle notes, but he has forgotten where to put the speech marks! Read the questions carefully and help Max fix his sentences.

Answer Key: 1. B, 2. True, 3. False, 4. B, 5. 'I love bananas!' said Max., 6. A, 7. B, 8. True, 9. 'Wait for me!' shouted Pip., 10. True. Remember: Speech marks go around the words actually spoken, and punctuation like commas or exclamation marks go inside the speech marks.

3. 3. True or False: You need to use speech marks when writing a summary of what someone said (indirect speech). (1 mark)

4. 4. Which sentence is punctuated correctly? A) 'Hello,' said Nova, 'the stars are bright today.' B) 'Hello', said Nova, 'the stars are bright today.' C) 'Hello' said Nova 'the stars are bright today.' D) Hello, said Nova, the stars are bright today. (1 mark)

5. 5. Punctuate this sentence: I love bananas said Max. (1 mark)

6. 6. What is the name for the part of the sentence that tells us who is speaking (e.g., 'said Max')? A) Reporting clause, B) Speech mark, C) Inverted comma, D) Direct speech. (1 mark)

7. 7. Where does the capital letter go if the direct speech starts the sentence? A) After the first speech mark, B) Inside the speech marks at the start of the spoken words, C) Before the speech mark, D) It doesn't need a capital. (1 mark)

8. 8. True or False: If the reporting clause comes before the speech, you put a comma after the reporting clause before opening the speech marks. (1 mark)

9. 9. Punctuate this sentence: Wait for me shouted Pip. (1 mark)

10. 10. True or False: Every time a new person speaks, you should start a new line. (1 mark)
