Think like a Word Detective! Look for the patterns hidden in our language.

- A synonym is a word that means the same thing as another word. For example, 'happy' and 'cheerful' mean almost the same thing.
- An antonym is a word that means the opposite of another word. For example, 'hot' is the antonym of 'cold'.
- An analogy shows how two things are related. For example, 'Bird is to Fly as Fish is to Swim.'
- A prefix goes at the start of a word to change its meaning, like 'un-' in 'unhappy'.
- A suffix goes at the end of a word, like '-ed' in 'jumped' to show that something already happened.
