

Ma Famille - French Assessment (Year 5)

Learning objective: To identify, describe, and write about family members using possessive adjectives and simple descriptive phrases in French.

Read each question carefully. Write your answers in French where indicated, or in English where requested. Ensure you use correct spelling and accents.

Rosa the parrot is showing her photo album to her friends. She says: 'Voici ma famille! Mon père est grand et ma mère est très gentille. J'ai un frère qui s'appelle Marc et une petite sœur qui s'appelle Sophie. Mon grand-père est très amusant.'

3. Fill in the gaps: Use 'mon' (masculine) or 'ma' (feminine) to complete these sentences: 1. ____ frère, 2. ____ mère, 3. ____ grand-père, 4. ____ sœur. (4 marks) (4 marks)

4. Why do we use 'ma' for 'mère' but 'mon' for 'père'? Explain the grammar rule in English. (4 marks) (4 marks)

5. Rosa says her grandfather is 'amusant'. Name two other adjectives you could use to describe a family member in French and provide their English translation. (4 marks) (4 marks)

6. Extended Writing Task: Write 5 sentences in French describing your own family or an imaginary family. Include their names, who they are, and one adjective for each person. (5 marks) (5 marks)

7. If you wanted to say 'my brothers' (plural), which word from the word bank would you use? (4 marks) (4 marks)
