- **Le petit-déjeuner** is the first meal of the day, often consisting of a croissant or tartine (bread with butter).
- To express your opinion, use 'J'aime' for foods you enjoy and 'Je n'aime pas' for those you dislike.
- France is famous for producing over 1,600 different varieties of cheese, from creamy Brie to tangy Roquefort.
- When ordering a meal, polite French speakers always remember to say 'S'il vous plaît' (please) and 'Merci' (thank you).
- Many French families enjoy a multi-course dinner, starting with a starter (entrée) followed by a main dish (plat).

Did you know? Did you know? In France, the baguette is so iconic that there is actually a law called the 'Décret Pain' which states that traditional baguettes can only be made using four simple ingredients: flour, water, salt, and yeast!
