

Rosa's Guide to French Opinions!

Speak your mind, the French way! Join Rosa the parrot to master the art of sharing your opinions.

- To say you enjoy something, start your sentence with 'J'aime' followed by the item, for example: 'J'aime le football'.
- To express a strong dislike, use the phrase 'Je n'aime pas', which wraps around the verb like a sandwich.
- When you want to say something is excellent, use the word 'super' after the phrase 'C'est'.
- Use the word 'délicieux' to describe food that you find tasty, such as 'C'est délicieux!'
- Remember that in French, adjectives must agree with the noun, though for general opinions, 'C'est' remains very useful.

Did you know? Did you know? In French, when you use the phrase 'J'aime' (I like) or 'J'adore' (I love), you often use 'le', 'la', or 'les' afterwards, such as 'J'adore le chocolat!' It is a wonderful way to add detail to your sentences.
