

Shopping with Rosa in France

Learning objective: To learn how to name food items and say how much they cost in French.

Rosa the parrot is at a French market. Look at the word bank to help you. Fill in the blanks and answer the questions below.

Word bank: une pomme (an apple) · un croissant (a croissant) · une banane (a banana) · deux euros (two euros) · c'est combien ? (how much is it?) · s'il vous plaît (please)

1. Rosa wants to buy an apple. Write the French word for apple here: (1 mark)

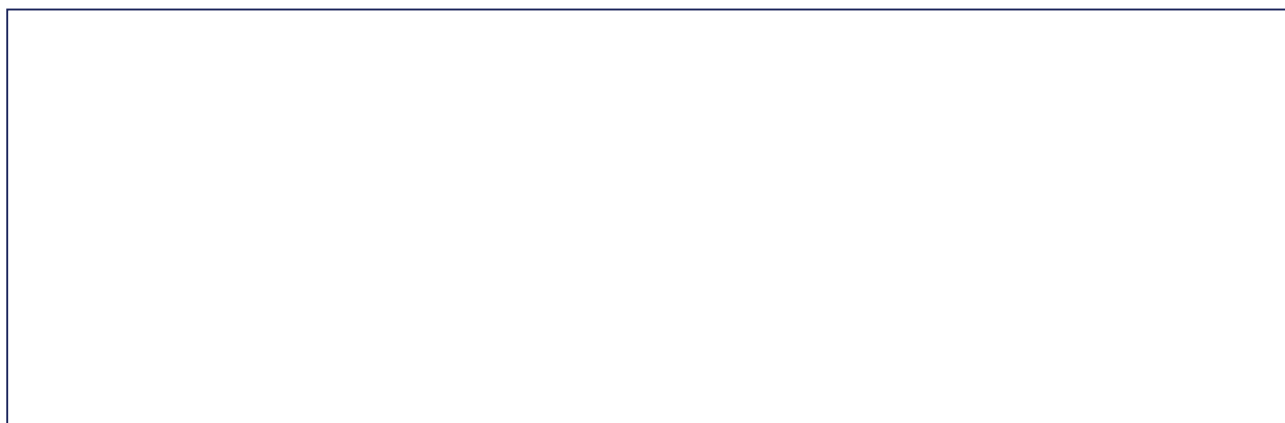
2. If you want to ask the shopkeeper 'How much is it?', what do you say? Start with: ' _____ ?' (2 marks)

3. If the shopkeeper says 'deux euros', how much does the item cost in English? (1 mark)

4. Write a sentence to ask for a banana politely. Use 'Je voudrais...' (I would like...) and 's'il vous plaît'. (2 marks)

5. Match the French word to the English word by drawing a line or writing them next to each other: Un croissant = _____ (1 mark)
