

Au Marché avec Rosa: French Shopping Skills

Learning objective: To learn vocabulary for shopping in a French market, understand prices in Euros, and use phrases to purchase items.

Read the price tags and use the vocabulary provided to help Rosa complete her shopping list. Remember to use polite phrases when interacting with the market stall holders.

Rosa the parrot is visiting a local French market. She has a shopping list and needs to buy a crusty loaf of bread, some delicious cheese, and a fresh red apple. She needs to ask for the prices and pay the correct amount in euros.

Word bank: Combien ça coûte ? · Je voudrais... · S'il vous plaît · Merci · La pomme · Le pain · Le fromage · Un euro · Cinq euros · Dix euros

1. Rosa wants to buy bread. Write the French phrase she should use to ask for the bread politely. (2 marks)

2. If a piece of cheese costs 5 euros, write the price in French words. (2 marks)

3. Rosa needs to ask the shopkeeper how much the apple costs. Write the correct French question. (2 marks)

4. Translate the following shopping list items into French: 1. The apple, 2. The bread, 3. The cheese. (3 marks)

5. If Rosa buys an apple for 1 euro and a loaf of bread for 2 euros, how much does she spend in total? Write your answer as a French sentence. (2 marks)

Draw: Draw Rosa the parrot at a colourful French market stall. Include a sign showing the prices of the fruit and bread in euros.



Extension challenge: Research what the currency of France is called. Why do we use Euros in France instead of British Pounds (£)?
