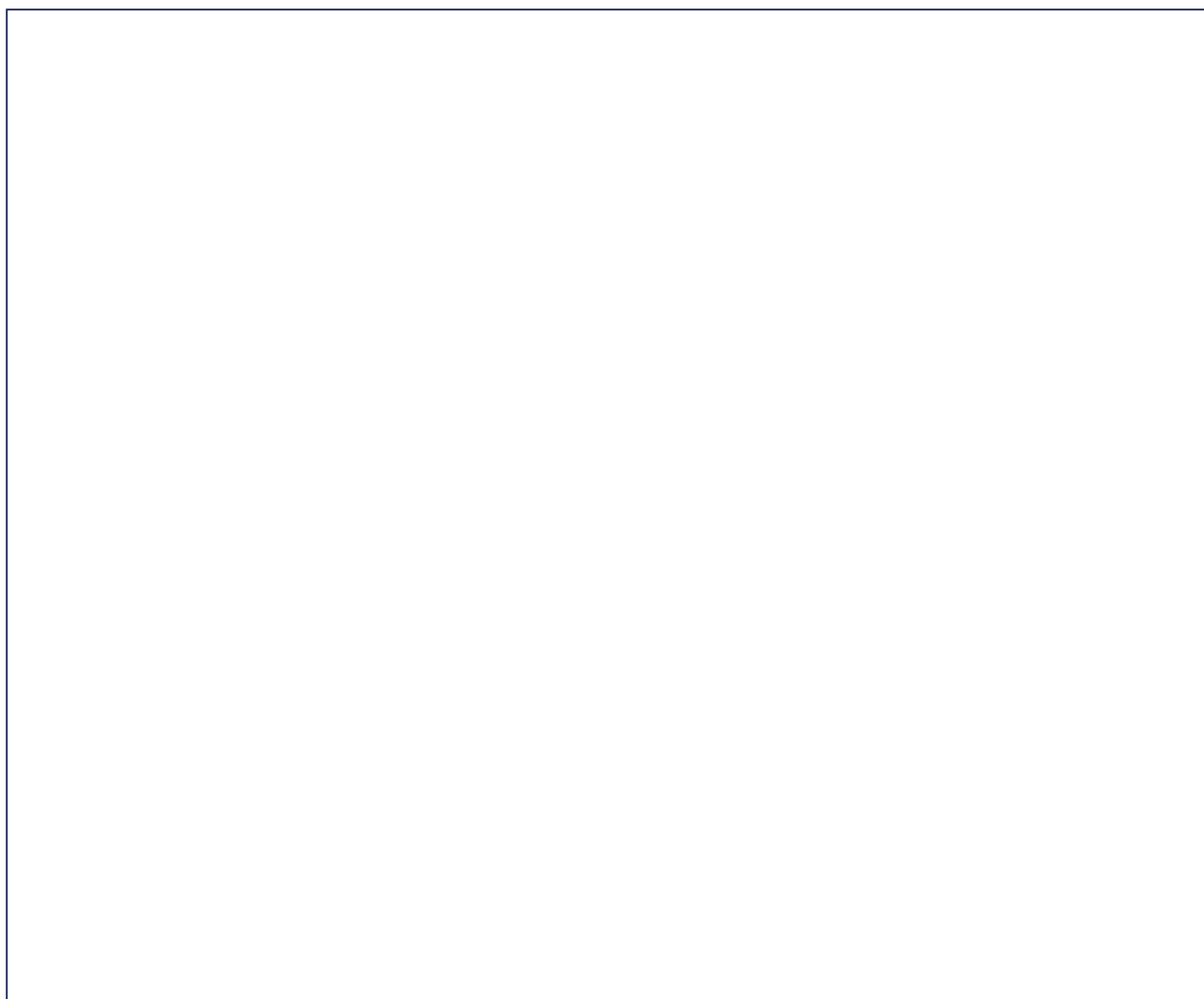


Rosa's Weather Sketchbook

Learning objective: To identify and label key weather phrases in French and represent them visually in a creative scene.

Follow the drawing prompt to create your weather scene. Once your drawing is complete, use the French word bank to label the different weather conditions occurring in your picture. Ensure your handwriting is clear and neat.

Draw: Draw a large, vibrant landscape divided into four different sections, each showing a different type of weather. In one section, draw a bright sun with clear skies (*Il fait beau*). In another, draw grey clouds with raindrops falling (*Il pleut*). In the third, draw trees leaning to one side to show a breeze (*Il fait du vent*). In the final section, draw snowflakes landing on the ground (*Il neige*). Use colourful pencils or felt-tips to make your scene lively and detailed.



Label words: Il fait beau · Il pleut · Il fait du vent · Il y a des nuages · Il neige · Il fait chaud · Il fait froid

Steps:

1. Label your drawing by writing the correct French phrase next to at least four different weather elements you have drawn.
2. Explain why it is important for a weather forecaster to use accurate vocabulary when describing the

climate in a specific region.

3. Compare and contrast 'Il fait beau' and 'Il fait chaud'. Can it be one without the other? Justify your answer.
4. What might happen to the activities in your drawing if the weather suddenly changed from 'Il fait beau' to 'Il pleut'?
5. If you were travelling to a cold country, which two phrases from the word bank would be most useful to know? Explain your choice.
6. Create a short French sentence to describe the current weather outside your classroom window today.
