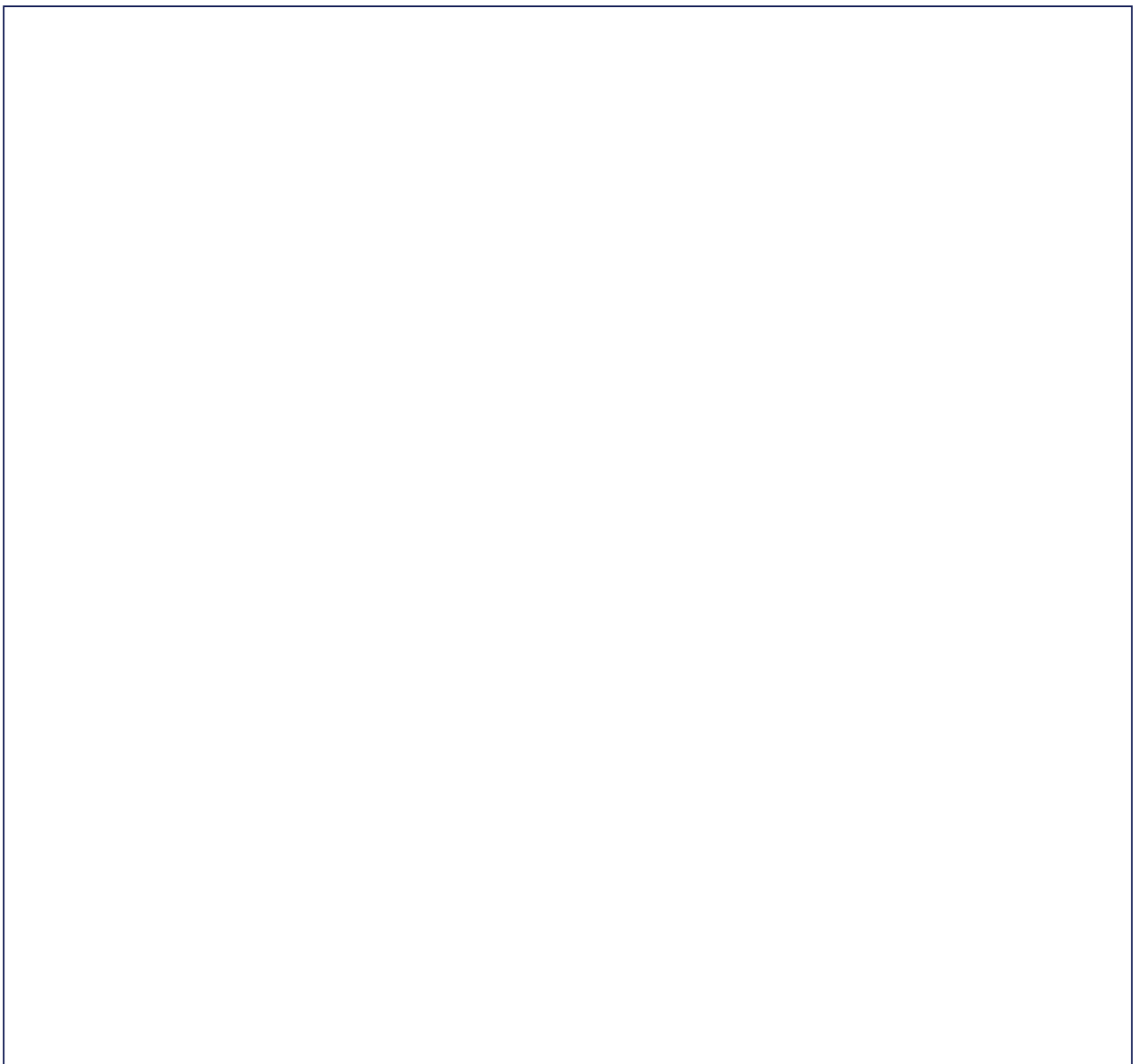


Finn's Geography Adventure: Natural and Built Worlds

Learning objective: To identify and distinguish between physical features (natural) and human features (built) in our local environment.

Look at the picture below. Use your crayons to colour the natural things green or blue, and the buildings or roads in your favourite bright colours. Then, complete the labels at the bottom to show what you have found!

Colour this: A friendly scene featuring Finn the dolphin wearing a small explorer's hat, pointing towards a divided landscape. On the left side, draw physical features: a large, rounded hill, a winding river, and a cluster of leafy trees. On the right side, draw human features: a small cottage with a chimney, a paved road with a crossing, and a red post box. Keep the outlines bold and thick for easy colouring. Ensure Finn looks welcoming and is positioned in the middle of the scene.



Steps:

1. Label the physical feature (e.g., hill, river, or tree) in your picture.
2. Label the human-made feature (e.g., house, road, or bridge) in your picture.
